Patriot's Pen, a youth-essay writing contest is a nationwide competition designed to foster patriotism by giving students in grades 6, 7 and 8 the opportunity to write essays expressing their views on democracy. Annually, more than 131,000 students participate in the contest.



The National Association of Secondary School Principals has placed this program on the NASSP National Advisory List of Contests and Activities for 2016-2017.

Contestants write a 300-400 word essay based on an annual patriotic theme. The first-place National winner receives a \$5000 cash award and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington D.C. The top state winners compete to win one of 46 national awards totaling \$46,000.

How to Enter: Loudoun County Virginia students should first draft their essay based on this year's theme: "America's Gift to My Generation" then submit their essay, along with the required entry form by 31 Oct 2017, to:
