LEESBURG, VA - October 7th marked the 80th anniversary of VFW Post 1177 charter signing. To mark the occasion, post members hosted a potluck celebration at the post home, inviting all members, family, friends and the community.

Longevity pins were also presented to members present for 5, 10, 15 and 20 years of membership within the VFW.

Even the Post Jeep made an appearance, always a hit with the younger crowd who were given the opportunity to climb aboard and try on some military gear. The Post 1177 Auxiliary supported the event by providing fun activities for children of all ages.

Post 1177 has its distant origins in Purcellville prior to being restated in Leesburg in 1937. Its membership have included several key leaders of the local and county government.

In June 2011, the Post merged with Sterling VFW Post 9478, increasing post membership and making it the sole VFW for Loudoun County.^A

Post Officially Awarded All-American Status

LEESBURG, VA - During the September 6th Monthly Members Meeting, Post 1177 was formally awarded All-American status for the 2016-2017 year. The presentation included a certificates for the Post and Post Commander, Ray Depesche, a streamer for the Post Guidon and a special All-American Cap for the Post Commander.

All members of the post who were active during the July 2016 to June 2017 time period are authorized to purchase the AllAmerican pin (at post shop) and/or member cap.

Of the over 7,200 posts worldwide only over 220 posts earn this honor. There are multiple criteria for earning All-American status to include membership goals, fundraising efforts, volunteer hours and participation at VFW events.

Post 1177 has earned All-American status a total of five times since the merger. \bigstar

Post 1177 Jeep Makes Appearances at Airshows

DULLES AIRPORT, VA - One of our more unique post members, the 1953 Willy M38A1 Jeep has been making appearances at the local aviation shows. The leep, under command by Post JAG officer Dennis Boykin, has been exhibited and offered photo opportunities at the 2017 Dulles Plane Pull on September 23rd and the Leesburg Air Show on September 30th.

The Willys leep were built for US Military service between 1952 and 1957 and were used by all branches of the military in Korea, the Dominican Republic and the Vietnam War. They were also used by the US Forest Service and the Border Patrol. Variations were used as ambulances.

The Post Jeep was restored by Loudoun County school teacher Rick Murdock. This included a full restoration of the engine, electrical system, body parts and decals. Period correct equipment was also installed, such as the radios. The vehicle, when restoration started, was previously painted in a pink camouflage!

Now she works like a dream. The jeep also has a cargo trailer, a soft-top and, on occasion, has towed the post Howitzer for car shows and events.

President Approves New Memorial - VFW Behind Creation

WASHINGTON, DC - The national commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States is saluting President Trump for signing the VFW -supported Global War on Terrorism Memorial Act into law on August 18th. The signing now clears the way for the GWOT Memorial Foundation to work with the National Capital Memorial Advisory Commission to secure federal approval for acreage on the National Mall, as well as coordinate a national competition for the memorial's design. It also exempts the GWOT Memorial from a provision in the Commemorative Works Act of 1986 that requires Congress to wait 10 years after the official end of a military conflict before

considering a war memorial in the nation's capital.

"Sixteen years ago, no one would have thought it possible for America to fight a nonstop, multi-front war for so long with just an all-volunteer force," said VFW National Commander Keith Harman, "That we have that they have — and continue to do so magnificently, is a testament not only to this generation's patriotism but of their character, as well. The VFW is very proud to support this memorial, and we are extremely proud that VFW members are the driving force behind its creation."

The GWOT Memorial Foundation founder and executive director, Andrew Brennan, is a life member of VFW Post 3945 in Pittsburgh. The legislation was introduced in the House by Rep. Mike Gallagher (R-Wis.), a life member of VFW Post 2037 in Green Bay, Wis., and Rep. Seth Moulton, a member of VFW Post 2005 in Marblehead, Mass. Its companion bill in the Senate was introduced by Sen. Joni Ernst (R-lowa), a life member of VFW Post 2265 in Red Oak, Iowa, and Sen. Joe Manchin (D-W.Va.), a strong veterans' advocate who also co-chairs the Senate Post-9/11 Veterans Caucus.

VA and Walgreens Team Up to Fight the Flu

WASHINGTON, DC - This flu season the VA has again teamed up with national retail pharmacy Walgreens to provide no-cost flu vaccinations for enrolled Veterans through the VA Retail Immunization Care Coordination Program. This partnership offered greater access to flu vaccine, and as a result more than 70,000 Veteran patients received flu shots at a local Walgreens last year. The partnership between VA and Walgreens continues to grow and the current vaccination period is now through March 31, 2018.

All Veterans who are currently enrolled in VA care may walk into any of the over 8,000 Walgreens to receive a vaccination at no cost. After presenting a Veterans identification card and a photo ID, a Walgreens pharmacist administers the vaccine and transmits that information securely to VA where it becomes part of the patient's electronic medical record.
